## Skopje, North Macedonia Oct. 4th-Nov. 24th, 2024

Last fall we took a trip of discovery and travelled to Athens and Skopje. While there, we connected with two of the leaders of the Glasnost Church, based in downtown Skopje. We were excited to see a vibrant international church with members from Macedonia and around the world. Their focus for the year was to be 'Intentional Relationships.' This caught our attention as it is an important concept and value for us and for CLIMB Intercultural. We also discovered that they have many outreaches to the community around them. To name a few they make meals once a week with others in the community to help those suffering from housing insecurity. There is also an outreach to the Suto Orizari neighbourhood, the largest Roma community in all of Europe. This community is often overlooked and suffers very high unemployment. They also value discipling young believers and meet with the large Albanian Muslim community located on the western side of the city.

They have many more opportunities for outreaches and while we are there we would like to help, encourage and support them in the work already being done. Our vision has always been to come alongside & assist the Nationals as they are much more aware of the current needs and how best to address these challenges.

We would be extremely grateful for your prayers, both leading up to the trip and while we are overseas, for the following:

- For discernment to be able to listen to God (and to seek to do His will and not our own)
- For wisdom regarding which areas to help (and to not take on more than we can handle)
- For patience and grace as we learn another culture (and to put people ahead of projects)
- For Jesus-type love (and to build relationships with no agenda except to genuinely desire to get to know more of God's children)
